


Map of the area


The Museum was founded in 1997 by Nico Brederoo and Henk Boelmans Kranenburg and now has an impressive collection of more than 350 lanterns, thousands of lantern slides and a broad overview of pre-cinema history. It has facilities for performances for up to 50 people and has, among other things, a spacious bar and a coffee room. A garden is also available when the weather is nice. The museum and theatre are located on the ground floor, with the coffee room and garden one floor lower via a flight of stairs.

Teylers Museum, Spaarne 16, 2011 CH Haarlem, NL – <u>www.teylersmuseum.nl</u>

The oldest museum in the Netherlands, founded in 1784. With an impressive collection of scientific instruments, fossils and paintings. Located in a 17th/18th-century house and with exhibition spaces from the 18th and 19th centuries. For us it is extra interesting because of their current exhibition *The Great Illusion: 200 Years of Virtual Realities*.

How to get there

Flight connections are best via Amsterdam (Schiphol) and Rotterdam (Rotterdam-The Hague airport).

From Schiphol take the train to Den Haag HS station, then tram line 1 (towards Scheveningen Noord) to the Duinstraat stop. This is literally right opposite the Museum.

From Rotterdam Airport take bus line 33 to Meijersplein metro station, metro to Den Haag Centraal station, then take bus 22 towards Scheveningen – get off at the Prins Willemstraat stop almost in front of the Museum.

Rail connections are possible from most parts of Europe, either direct to Den Haag or by changing at Amsterdam or Rotterdam Centraal. There are some direct trains from London to Rotterdam via Eurostar – if there is no suitable direct train, take Eurostar to Brussels and change there for Rotterdam. From Rotterdam Centraal take the train to Den Haag HS and then take tram line 1 (as from Schiphol, above).

Where to stay

Hotels in Scheveningen come in all shapes and sizes – here are a few suggestions, but there are many more:

5 stars: such as the Grand Hotel Amrâth Kurhaus (by the sea) and the Leonardo Royal Hotel Promenade (in a park), both about 1.1km from the Magic Lantern Museum. Both can be reached via tram line 1 from the Museum.

4 stars: Hotel Fletcher (0.8km from Museum), Inntel hotels The Hague Marina beach (1.2km), Bilderberg Europa hotel (1.2km), Novotel World Forum (1.4km), Carlton Beach (1.5km).


3 stars: Ocean House Scheveningen (0.3km), Boulevard Hotel (0.5km), Andante aan Zee (0.5km), Hotel Albion (0.7km), Ibis Styles (0.8km), Ramada The Hague (1.2km), Strandhotel Scheveningen (1.5km).

2 stars: Easyhotel (0.8km).

All these hotels of course have their own advantages, disadvantages and packages – choose which suits you best. Most of them can be easily reached by tram line 1 or bus 22.

Things to see and places to go

There are several museums in Den Haag, a short bus or tram ride from Scheveningen. You can find travel directions on their websites.

<u>Panorama Mesdag</u> (3 km away): a panorama depicting Scheveningen in 1878, still in its own building which has never been altered. Hendrik Willem Mesdag was a well-known Hague School painter.

<u>Escher in The Palace</u> (5 km): a permanent exhibition of the work of M.C. Escher, filled with his impossible buildings and world-famous metamorphoses.

The Art Museum (2.5 km), with many works by Mondrian in its collection.

<u>The Mauritshuis</u> (5 km), equivalent to the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam in terms of its holdings of old masters.

Museum Hofwijk (9 km), the country house of Constantijn and Christiaan Huygens in Voorburg.

For the scientists among us, a little further away in Leiden (20 km) is the <u>Boerhaave</u> Museum.

And in Heiloo (85 km) Martin Vliegenthart's <u>Magic Lantern Museum</u> is at Kennemerstraatweg 464. The museum is easily accessible by train from Scheveningen, and is open on Friday 14, Sunday 16 (afternoon) and Monday 17 June, by advance booking only.
