EUROPEAN FUNDING FOR A RESEARCH PROJECT ON NINETEENTH-**CENTURY MAGIC LANTERN SLIDES**

The research project 'A Million Pictures: Magic Lantern Slide Heritage as Artifacts in the Common European History of Learning', has received funding via the 'Joint Programming Initiative in Cultural Heritage' from the European Commission.

Between June 2015 and May 2018, researchers from the universities of Utrecht (NL), Exeter (UK), Antwerp (BE), Girona (ES) and Salamanca (ES) will carry out research on lantern slides that were used for educative purposes in Europe. In close cooperation with museums, archives, curators, people working in the creative industries, and, of course, collectors, this project will develop a standard for documentation and conservation of magic lantern slides that serves the needs of all possible stakeholders. A number of MLS members are already involved in this research project, representing the various institutions in which they work.

Many libraries and museums have thousands of magic lantern slides in their collections, yet there is no standard procedure for documenting and conserving them. This limits the accessibility of the objects for researchers and other interested parties. The magic lantern slides from the partners' collections will be digitalised and the metadata will be made accessible for further research, probably via the Lucerna database (www.slides.uni-trier.de).

As one of the project's aims is to bring together everyone with an interest in the discussion of standards for the description of lantern slides, many of the planned activities are open to the general public. Interested parties can subscribe to the project newsletter by sending an email to Sarah Dellmann (s.dellmann@uu.nl). The project website (http://www.uu.nl/a-million-pictures) will be online from mid-June 2015, giving detailed information on the project's progress and activities.

The Magic Lantern will regularly report on outcomes for MLS members. The first good news is that through its funding decision, the European Commission recognises that lantern slides are a significant part of our cultural heritage. And this in itself is already something to celebrate!
