

A BIT OF A PUZZLE

Lester Smith found this jigsaw puzzle of a lantern projection of the Chain Pier, Brighton, to some little children. The pier was opened in 1823, costing £28,000, and destroyed in a storm in 1896.

Much later Lester came across a black and white print of the same image with the heading 'Nister's Magic Lantern'. The man depicted would appear to be Ernest Nister (1842-1909) who built up a collection of Victorian children's books over many years, now kept in the British Library. This includes rare examples of 'pop-up' books and provides a glimpse into the world of Victorian children and the entertainment available to them.

MORE ON SHADOWS

Following his article on Charles H. Bennett's shadows in *TML* 35, **Dick Moore** has uncovered more information. He writes: "As mentioned in the article, prior to the 1860 publication of the book *Shadows and Substance*, Bennett's images, with wood engravings by Joseph Swain, and prose by R.B. Brough, were issued in ten separate parts by William Kent (1858-1859). The covers were the same for each (right) except for the volume numbers and each contained three images with related prose. Further research has found that the Bill Douglas Cinema Museum in Exeter University has Volumes II (Slavey, Jack-Daw, Equestrian), III (Feline, Toady, Says All), IV (A Bird of Prey, Spooney, a Lion) and VII (Ape-ing the Fashion, A Pastoral Petticoat, Windbag) in their collection.

Very sad news for many MLS members, our former long-serving research officer **Stephen Herbert** passed away on 3 September. He had been ill for some time but that did not prevent him from joining our meetings when he could and generously sharing his enormous expertise on magic lanterns, related topics and technologies, and early cinema – including in contributions to *TML*. There will be a tribute to Stephen in our next edition.



In another follow-up to Dick's article, at the Summer Meeting (see p. 15) Theresa Simkin revealed her and her late husband Mike's love of Charles Bennett's images and showed us two books they owned – an original copy of *Shadows* (1856) and a book published three years later, *Moveable Shadows for the People* by William

Newman with animated versions of the Bennett illustrations (when you pull a paper tab the figure moves to reveal his or her shadow). The two artists both worked for *Punch* and would certainly have known each other but whether the second book was produced on friendly or 'rip off' terms, Theresa did not know.
