He was a clever and quite extraordinary man, whose skills ranged from tool making, building racing car engines, hydraulic research, precision woodworking, to later even forging a career in lace bobbin making that was so successful that beautiful examples of his creations in this art were exported worldwide.

Tony and myself presented more than 350 magic lantern shows over the years, and it was only the onset of ill health that forced us to call a halt. He loved his magic lanterns, and would



spend hours in his shed repairing and restoring all the associated equipment pertaining to them. He will be much missed by his family and friends.
