EXHIBITION IN HESSEN

Bernd Scholze writes: "The exhibition is organised by the Hessenpark Neu-Ansprach (near Frankfurt) in co-operation with the DFF – the Deutsches Filminstitut & Filmmuseum – and myself. It gives an overview of the production of children's slides in Germany showing

examples from the beginnings in the 1780s up to the 1930s. The early slides are from my collection, the later lithographic slides from the Filmmuseum. The exhibition also shows children's lanterns from the same period. You can download the brochure (in German) at www.hessenpark.de. There will be two lantern shows on 19 June (for visitors) and 20 June (for the PhotoHistorica e.V.). The exhibition runs until 28 December 2025."
